

BACKGROUND & OVERVIEW:

The Port of Olympia has signed an Agreed Order (AO) with the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) related to evaluating and cleaning up contaminated sediments in Budd Inlet in both West Bay (marine terminal) and in East Bay (marina/boatworks), as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). This AO lays out the agreement between Ecology and Port for addressing past practices originating from Port property that have contributed to environmental contamination. Originally signed in December of 2008, the AO was amended in 2012 to require additional environmental characterization and cleanup alternatives analysis. Following this amendment, the Port was also awarded a MTCA Remedial Action Grant (RAG) to complete some of the additional work identified in the amended AO.

In 2015, the current RAG agreement between Ecology and the Port was put into place, with a total project cost of \$4,177,340, with 50% of that to be provided by the Port, and a completion date of 2019. There have been two approved amendments to the RAG agreement, both of which were to extend the completion date – first to June 30, 2021 and most recently to June 30 of 2023. To-date, the total project costs expended have been \$579,439, of which the Port has received \$203,722 in reimbursements from Ecology with another \$85,998 pending reimbursement.

The original technical consultant that has assisted the Port on this project since 2009 is Anchor QEA, and their most recent contract expired on 12/31/2021. A decision was made to conduct a new competitive solicitation for a technical consultant to help the Port complete its current obligations under the amended AO and amended RAG agreement, and to assist with future design, permitting and/or construction of environmental cleanup actions that will come out of the current required work. Two consulting teams responded to the Port's Request for Qualifications, and following interviews and presentations by both, the Port selection committee is recommending the team lead by Dalton Olmsted Fuglevand (DOF). The DOF team had a better understanding of the Port's needs for not only cleaning up contaminated sediments, but to also meet the ongoing maintenance dredging needs of both the Port and the US Army Corps Of Engineers.

Staff is requesting the Commission approve a contract with DOF for an initial term, scope and budget that is focused on helping the Port meet its current obligations to Ecology under the amended AO and amended RAG agreement. Staff anticipates bringing future amendments to this contract with DOF to

the Commission for consideration and approval as future work and associated costs to achieve cleanup actions are identified, designed, permitted and constructed. Future contract amendments will be accompanied by clearly identified and secured financial resources, which may include Port funds, grants, direct appropriations and/or other partner/stakeholder funds.

The initial term of the proposed contract with DOF is from June 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, with an initial not-to-exceed cost of \$3.5 million, both of which are aligned with the current amended RAG agreement. The Port's portion of this initial cost is \$1.75 million, part of which is budgeted in 2022, with the remaining portion to be budgeted in 2023. This effort is focused on completing the investigation work that is required, as well as beginning the extensive design and permitting required to facilitation the first phase of clean up construction targeted to begin during the in water construction work window from July 15, 2024 to February 15, 2025.

Additional budgetary information and details related to the specific work will be provided in the staff materials included in the meeting packet for July 25, 2022. At that meeting, staff will be requesting the Commission approve the DOF contract for the initial scope and budget outlined above, to support the Port's efforts to comply with our existing amended AO and amended RAG agreement by the deadline of June 30, 2023.

Budd Inlet RAG Terms

- Current Agreement signed 2017
 - Provide data, analysis, evaluations re: nature and extent of contamination:
 - Berthing areas
 - In-water log storage area
 - Under the pier
 - In-water areas in East Bay
- Expiration date was 6/30/2019
- Amendment 1 = extend expiration date to 6/30/2021
- Amendment 2 = extend expiration date to 6/30/2023



Budd Inlet RAG \$\$

- Total Eligible Costs = \$4,177,340
- Eligible Costs split 50/50 = \$2,088,670 Port Funds
- Total Eligible expended to-date = \$579,439
 - Reimbursement received = \$203,722
 - Reimbursement pending = \$85,998
- Total remaining = \$3,597,901
 - Remaining Port obligation = \$1,798,950
 - 2022 Budget and 2023 Budget*
- Required to be spent by 6/30/2023
