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



	Recorded Port Commission meetings currently available on the internet at the Port's website are a valued source of public education. However, those recorded meetings have the potential for reaching a much larger audience in Thurston County via cable television. In the past, Port Commission meetings were cablecast on what was then Thurston Community Television (TCTV). Deborah Vinsel, Executive Director of Thurston Community Media (TCMedia - new name, same organization), explained to me a couple of weeks ago that if Port Commissioners make the request, TCMedia would, at no cost to the Port , schedule recorded Port Commission meetings to be broadcast two or three times a week on either Channel 3 or Channel 26. Your recorded meetings would run during the week or weeks between live Port meetings. Ms. Vinsel explained that

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scheduling Port meetings would have no impact on the TCMedia workload. They welcome the opportunity to offer the public greater access to the Port.

As you may know, TCMedia is a non-profit organization that, among other services, contracts with local governments to record and cablecast their public meetings. Thurston County Commission meetings, Tumwater City Council meetings, and the City of Olympia Council meetings are currently recorded and made available by TCMedia on cable TV channels 3 or 26. About four or five years ago, the Port of Olympia ended their contract with TCMedia and purchased their own recording equipment. TCMedia would have continued to broadcast the recorded Port meetings, but, according to Ms. Vinsel, TCMedia was unable to get access to the Port's recordings due to a technical issue with the recorded files.

I would like to ask the Port Commission to contact Deborah Vinsel with a request to broadcast recorded Port Commission meetings and work sessions on TCMedia channels. As a public service, you would be offering citizens, who currently have access to basic cable in Thurston County, an opportunity to learn about the Port commensurate with what is offered by other local governments. Not only would this provide increased Port transparency, but Port Commission meetings available on television would potentially reach new audiences throughout Thurston County.
