Actively finalizing the 2026 budget and preparations to support a smooth onboarding and transition for newly elected commissioners.

Environmental

Staff are actively managing operations at our stormwater treatment facility to ensure strong performance throughout November's rainy season. Our team is also working closely with the Department of Ecology to advance grant-funded efforts for the upcoming Boatworks stormwater system upgrade.

Marine Terminal

Longshore operations are ongoing, with crews still loading out September's paper pulp at a rate of approximately 17-20 trucks per day. Our next log vessel is scheduled to arrive November 27, and the next paper pulp vessel ETA is scheduled for December 7.

November began with a visit from Ann Richart, WSDOT Aviation Director, to support a film highlighting the vital role of Washington's airports in transportation, economic development, and community benefit. Our maintenance team is preparing for winter operations, and we look forward to welcoming our new Airport Operations and Administration Specialist, on November 16.
